THE ABOLITION OF MAN



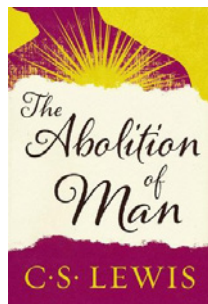

In several of his publications, C. S. Lewis championed the doctrine of objective value—the notion that the nature of the world and of humanity demands a proper response to the worthiness of creation. One of these, *The Abolition of Man*, is a brief but rich exposition defending objective value, exhorting us to cultivate it and warning about the perils of rejecting it. In the fictional *Space Trilogy*, Lewis offers the same warnings by tracing the adventures of Elwin Ransom as he confronts the consequences of his society's rejection of the doctrine. Our class will examine *Abolition* in depth while seasoning the discussion with selected references to the trilogy.

We will study theologically:

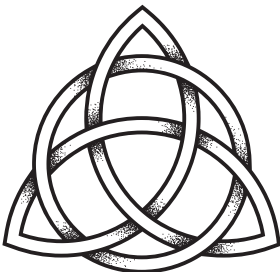
- Their personhood within the Trinity.

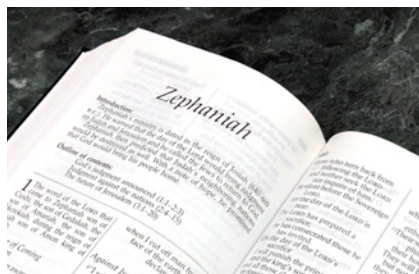

THE LENT EXPERIENCE

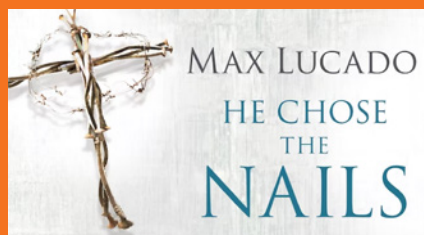

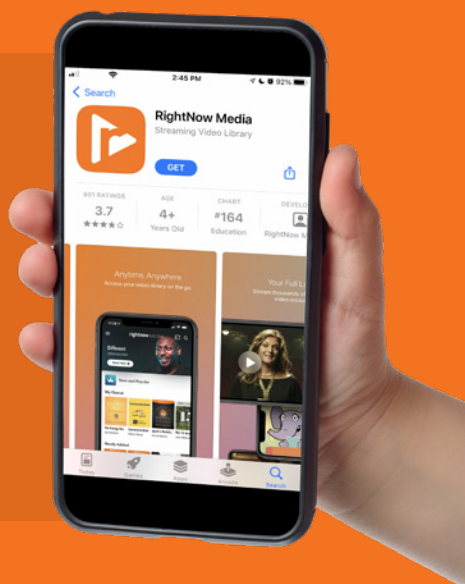
HE CHOSE THE NAILS

AGAPE JOURNEYS

A diverse group of adults seeking a personal and growing relationship with Christ, biblical teaching, contemporary music, fun social events, mission opportunities, lasting and loving friendships and laughter. The lead teacher is Pastor Mateen Ellass.

BASECAMP (20S)

Each Sunday, people who are college age through their 20s gather on the fourth floor in the Cathedral Room for “Base Camp,” led by Pastor Greg Hartnett. In this time, we discuss Scripture and various topics. This serves as a launching point for other opportunities to establish community. If you’re in college or in your 20s, this is a fantastic place to get connected with others in a similar life stage who are looking to follow the Lord!

BECOMERS

The foundations of this class for both couples and singles are: (1) verse-by-verse inductive study of the Bible, (2) support of God’s worldwide mission via missionary couples, (3) caring prayer for one another’s needs and (4) warm, meaningful fellowship. The lead teacher is Don Wallace.

HEADWATERS

This is for young married couples and couples with school-age children, with the goal to enhance Christ-centered marriages and establish healthy families through practical application of biblical teaching. “For the word of God is living and active, sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing to the division of soul and of spirit, of joints and marrow, and discerning the thoughts and intentions of the heart” (Hebrews 4:12). KOINONIA

“Koinonia,” the Greek word for fellowship, is a warm and welcoming community of both single and married adults of all ages. Our time together focuses on encouraging one another to grow as Christ followers through interactive study of Scripture. We support each other by prayer and have a legacy of giving to the worldwide mission of the church. Led by community members.

NEW AMBASSADORS

With a focus on in-depth, expository teaching of Scripture and on living out Jesus’ command to “love one another as I have loved you,” Bible study, discussion and fellowship are at the center of this class. The lead teacher is Pastor Junior McGarrahan.

NEW HORIZONS

A supportive, friendly, biblically based community focused on spiritual growth and relationship building is open to individuals and couples. Our gathering features interactive Bible lessons, sharing, prayer, mission support, music and social events. The lead teachers are Corat Moran, Ray Parry and Rich Poturalski.

NORTHLANDERS

Each Sunday, the class discusses the sermon topic and Scripture from the 8:30 a.m. Sanctuary service. The majority of people in this community live in northern Colorado Springs, but this group is open to all. Led by community members.

PATHFINDERS

The focus is Bible-based learning through lectures, but class time also includes praise singing, sharing prayer needs, and fellowship with friends over coffee and snacks. Small social groups afford opportunities for strangers to become friends. The class supports multiple missionaries, scholarship funds and projects in the local community.
